


- 1) OPENING PRFORMANCE: BRAZIL (Ary Barosso, arr. Hart Morris)

- 3) Simple Strokes & Basic Back-Beat (Simple 8-beat pop) Rhythm + Fill-Ins




4) 2nd Basic Rhythm (8 beat pop)


